The theme for the coming school year is

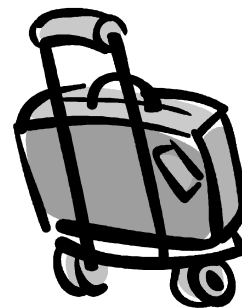
